June Feasts Days

In June, we have a number of special days that we celebrate in our Ukrainian-Greek Catholic Church. There are a number of higher-ranked feasts such as the Holy Eucharist and the Nativity of John the Baptist. We celebrate the New Ukrainian Martyrs that were beatified in Ukraine 20 years ago this year! We close out June with the feast of Sts. Peter and Paul, two of the most influential apostles in our Church.




Holy Eucharist (June 3)

The Feast of the Most Holy Eucharist is known as *Corpus Christi* in the Latin Church where this feast originates from. It has grown in popularity among Ukrainian Greek-Catholics around the world and as such as been included in many calendars. The feast itself is always 60 days after Pascha (Easter). The focus of this feast is to celebrate the Real Presence of the Body & Blood of our Lord in the Eucharist.

Nativity of John the Baptist (June 24)

St John the Baptist is usually called St John the Forerunner. This title indicates that the purpose of his ministry

was to prepare the way for the coming of Jesus Christ. In the Byzantine Rite, the Feast of his Nativity is celebrated on June 24. It is a major feast day and is celebrated with an All-Night Vigil. It has a post-feast of one day. The feast usually falls during the Apostles' Fast.





Ukrainian Martyrs (June 27)

On June 27, 2001, St. Pope John Paul II beatified a group of Ukrainian Catholics that included bishops, priests, monks,

nuns and laity from the 20th century. Many of these martyrs were martyred due to their strong stance against Soviet persecution in Ukraine throughout the 20th century. Notable members of this group are Bl. Omelian Kowch who is the greatgrandfather of Fr. Taras Kowch in Cooks Creek, MB.; Bl. Nykyta Budka who was our first bishop in Winnipeg and Canada; and of course Bl. Vasyl who died while living in

Winnipeg and has a shrine and museum in his honour at St. Joseph parish in Winnipeg where his body remains incorrupt.

Sts. Peter & Paul (June 29)

The Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul celebrates their martyrdom in Rome. These two saints of course are known as two of the greatest apostles and therefore we celebrate this feast with a fasting period leading up to it. The length of the fast period varies each year because it starts on the second Monday after Pentecost and runs to June 28th. All are encouraged to fast during this period and abstain from meat on Wednesdays and Fridays during the fast.



Cancelled Parish Praznyks

As this global pandemic continues to be part of our lives, it comes with a plethora of changes almost monthly. As the summer roles around that means Praznyk season is upon us as well. But unfortunately due to the current public health orders from the Province of Manitoba, we are limited as to what we can do and how we do it.

With keeping all of these rules in mind, many parishes (in particular the rural parishes that only have a couple services a year) have opted to cancel their services at the current time. The limit on number of attendees combined with the orders of distancing and so forth, make it difficult to carry out these services. Cancellation of praznyks will be a case by case decision when the time comes.

Fr. Jay will continue to do a Panakhyda service and bless ALL of the graves on the scheduled days. Recorded videos will be made available on Facebook & YouTube for all to watch and pray along with. Public gatherings are not allowed at this time both indoors and outdoors.

These are difficult times for all of us, and none of this is normal. But we must do our part to keep our parishes and our neighbours healthy and safe. As Christians, we can follow the rules and pray.

This summer once again, our camps & summer catechism programs are cancelled, at least in person. The Archeparchy of Winnipeg will be hosting a virtual camp this summer from July 4-10.

The theme for camp is Spirit Week! Each day will have a different theme, while we learn about the Holy Spirit all week long!

There will be two age groups and each will receive an hour and a half of online programing each day. Each camper will also receive a camp kit full of fun stuff and crafts to do at home along with extra challenges to do throughout the day.

All of this for only \$50 will also include some special guests throughout the week, family orientation on the Sunday evening and a closing Divine Liturgy on the Saturday!


Help Buy Wheelchairs for Children & Adults in Ukraine!



Question: Father, you always say Divine Liturgy, but I always say Mass. What's the difference?

Answer: The term 'mass' or 'Holy Mass' refers to the Eucharistic celebration common to the Roman Catholic Church. The etymology of the term 'mass' comes from either the Hebrew word for unleavened bread or even the Germanic word for assembly. The Divine Liturgy is the service we celebrate in the Byzantine Rite among others. The word 'liturgy' in it's Greek root means, "work of the people." Our Divine Liturgy is a work of the people, the Church, the Body of Christ who come together to pray together, hear the Word of God, and offer back the Eucharist to the One who offered It to us in the first place.

So there is actually a difference between 'mass' and the 'Divine Liturgy' and in our Ukrainian Catholic Church, we celebrate the Divine Liturgy, not the Holy Mass.

Question: Why did we start kneeling at Pentecost? I kneel all the time during the services.

Answer: The tradition in the Byzantine Rite is to not kneel during the Divine Liturgy on Sundays as well as during the entire Paschal season between Easter & Pentecost. The reason for this is that kneeling is a penitential act and celebrating the Lord's Resurrection, which we celebrate every Sunday at the Divine Liturgy, far exceeds any external manifestation of sorrow or lamentation over one's sins.

So you are allowed to kneel by all means for this is what most of us have been taught all of our lives. But all are encouraged to stand during the entire Divine Liturgy on Sundays, and throughout all services between Pascha (Easter) & Pentecost.
