Great Lent is upon us; time to come home!

Great Lent starts on February 28th this year, and I want to take a moment to remind everyone what it's all about. Great Lent, or the Great Fast is a time of preparation for our Lord's death and glorious resurrection. You'll notice that during Lent, a lot changes in our churches and should also change in our own day to day lives. The 40 days of Lent followed by Holy Week should feel much different than the rest of the year because of these changes.

First of all there are all the liturgical services. You'll notice that all of our linens in the church turn to dark colours like red and the priest will wear red during the week at liturgical services. Our services themselves change. The Sunday Divine Liturgy uses the Anaphora of St. Basil the Great instead of St. John Chrysostom; we don't celebrate the Divine Liturgy during the weekdays, but instead we pray Lenten matins. We also celebrate the Divine Liturgy of the Pre-sanctified Gifts on Fridays.

Secondly, our lives should change. We should pray more by attending these extra services or even just at home. We should pray for the deceased more by attending the Sorokousty services. We should also be changing our fasting from just Fridays to Wednesdays *and* Fridays. Our giving to others, almsgiving, should increase at this time too.

This year however, should be different. Why? This year we are looking forward to the easing of our public health orders in Manitoba which means that we can more freely attend our parishes once again. I want to take this opportunity to personally invite all of our parishioners, both young and old, back to our parishes. This is the perfect time to return home as not only are we physically able to, but we are called to during this time of preparation. As the father welcomes his prodigal son home, so too do we look forward to welcoming everyone back to church!

I challenge everyone to pick one service, circle it and plan to attend it!

Catechesis Corner

The Nicene Creed: Part 2

The Nicene Creed as we know it, is actually broken into four parts: our belief in God the Father, belief in God the Son, belief in God the Holy Spirit, and belief in the Holy, Catholic Apostolic Church. Even though in our liturgical books it is all one large statement, there are actual sections to it. Today we are going to delve into the second section, our belief in God the Son.

I believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father.
Through Him all things were made.
For us men and for our salvation He came down from Heaven:
by the power of the Holy Spirit He was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man.
For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate; He suffered, died, and was buried.
On the third day He rose again in fulfillment of the Scriptures:
He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,
and His kingdom will have no end.

If we look back in history to when the creed was first written, we see it was written first and foremost to do away with all the heresies that were being committed. What is a heresy? Saying and believing in things that are not true about God or the Church. For example, saying that Jesus was fully human but not fully God, or vice-versa. The early Church Fathers started to put these heresies down by establishing the creed so that we could all agree on the same thing. The first half of this section is meant to do exactly this.

So this first half confirms that Jesus is eternally begotten of the Father. Translation: Jesus as the Son of God has always existed, He did not just pop into existence at His earthly birth. Saying otherwise is called Arianism. This section also affirms that He is equal with the Father and describes how He came down to earth to be with us.

The second half of this section deals with all that happened to Him in regards to His death. We then affirm that all this was in accordance with the Scriptures (ie: foretold by the Prophets). The Scriptures are then something we can rely on fully. This section goes onto tell us where the Son of God is currently, and what is to happen in the future.

Great Lent Schedule

Great Lent is full of beautiful liturgical practices and services. We invite everyone from across the district to attend either in person or virtually, but especially in person this year to these special services that are held throughout Great Lent. Below is a schedule with a brief disclaimer about them.

First Week of Great Lent:

- Forgiveness Vespers The very first service of Great Lent which happens on the Sunday evening. Forgiveness is exchanged between all those present.
- Canon of St. Andrew of Crete Great Compline service, with special verses we read and respond with a prostration. This service will be on Monday & Wednesday.

Every Week of Great Lent:

- Stations of the Cross personal prayer devotion following the journey of Christ to the Cross. Served on Wednesday evenings.
- *Divine Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts* a unique Eucharistic service during Lent. Served Friday evenings.
- Lenten Matins The weekday matins service with special Lenten hymns & verses unique to Great Lent. Served Tuesday & Thursday mornings.
- *Sorokousty* Panakhyda services for the deceased. Prayed following both Wednesday and Friday services.


Sundays of Great Lent:

- Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great - contains the special anaphora of St. Basil and each week a different event or person is celebrated.

Fifth Week of Great Lent:

- Canon of St. Andrew of Crete - This service is once again celebrated but this time with the reading of the Life of St. Mary of Egypt. A truly deep and moving service.

Please come and immerse yourself in prayer throughout all of Great Lent at any of these services!
