Catechesis Corner

The Nicene Creed: Part 3

The Nicene Creed as we know it, is actually broken into four parts: our belief in God the Father, belief in God the Son, belief in God the Holy Spirit, and belief in the Holy, Catholic Apostolic Church. Even though in our liturgical books it is all one large statement, there are actual sections to it. Today we are going to delve into the third section, our belief in God the Holy Spirit.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, Who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son He is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

This next part is all about the Holy Spirit and is for the most part confirming the existence of the Holy Spirit. It also describes the position the Holy Spirit holds within the Holy Trinity.

The Holy Spirit is a very special part of the Trinity because it is how God's desires are made known here on earth. The largest example of this is all the prophets that He has spoken through. Going back all through the Old Testament, we read about all the times that the Holy Spirit either worked through the prophets to guide or teach the people of Israel, or sometimes those who were not Israelites. One of the interesting things is that prophets are not done yet. We often think of a prophet as someone that foretold Christ, but their jobs didn't end when Christ came to earth. There still may be prophets living among us today. God chooses how a prophet is to speak or communicate to the people, and it is through the Holy Spirit that all of this is made possible.

This part of the Creed also comes with a bit of a controversy. The Filioque. This tiny little part is only three words: *and the Son.* It is added by the Western Church at the end of the line that talks about where the Holy Spirit proceeds from. In our liturgy books, it is found in parenthesis. As Eastern Catholics, we believe that the Holy Spirit comes from only the Father, and not the Son. Understanding this is key to having a proper understanding of the Trinity. In Canada, the *Filioque* was officially omitted by the Ukrainian Greek-Catholic bishops in the early 2000s so as to return back to the original form of the Nicene Creed.


